STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Beckford Nature Reserve is a company limited by guarantee governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 28th April 2007. It is registered as a charity with The Charity Commission for England and Wales.

The Board of Trustees, which can have up to 5 members, administers the charity. As set out in the Articles of Association the Board of Trustees may appoint any person that they consider suitable to be a Trustee. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £10.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the company are:

- 1) To promote the conservation, protection and improvement of the physical and natural environment of the disused quarry pit known as Beckford Nature Reserve situated in the north of Beckford in the county of Worcestershire which incorporates the Beckford Gravel Pit Site of Special Scientific Interest; and
- 2) Insofar as it is incidental or ancillary to the conservation, protection and improvement of the above quarry pit and the surrounding area, such purposes for the benefit of the local community as shall be exclusively charitable.

The general aim of the charity is to maintain the Nature Reserve as a conservation area for use by the public and local residents.

The main objectives continue to be the promotion of the nature reserve with the aim of raising money so that it can continue with the conservation and improvement of the area.

The Trustees confirm that they have had regard to guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning activities.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

No major new work has been undertaken this year. General clearance and maintenance continued and repairs were made to both hides. Purchases were made of an automatic motion camera to record wildlife movements and a second dog waste bin to enable dog walkers to dispose of waste more easily.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Income increased this year to £3808 due to generous donations following the death of founding Trustee and Warden John Clifford. Repairs to the Hides increased costs a little but an increased surplus of £1107 was still achieved.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (issued in March 2005 and the special provisions in part 15 of the Companies Act 2006).

Independent Examiners Report to the Members of Beckford Nature Reserve

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2015 set out on pages 1 to 6.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The trustees (who are also directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

Having satisfied myself that the charity is not subject to audit under company law and is eligible for independent examination, it is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the 2011 Act;
- to follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

Independent examiner's statement

In connection with my examination, no matter has come to my attention:

- (1) which gives me reasonable cause to believe that in any material respect the requirements:
 - to keep accounting records in accordance with section 386 of the Companies Act 2006; and
